The purposes and legal basis for the processing of your personal data

We process your personal data for the following purposes and legal basis:

To pursue our legitimate interest in preventing and preventing crime, cf. Article 6 (1) (f) of the General Data Protection Regulation.

To pursue our legitimate interest in increasing the safety of Solar's employees and customers, cf. Article 6 (1) (f) of the General Data Protection Regulation.

In cases where the image and video material contains information about criminal offences, the processing will be based on section 8(3) of the Danish Data Protection Act, as the processing is necessary to safeguard our legitimate interest in being able to solve crime, cf. Article 10 of the General Data Protection Regulation.

In cases where information about criminal offences is processed in order for legal claims to be established, exercised or defended, the legal basis follows from section 8(5) of the Danish Data Protection Act, cf. section 7(1), cf. Article 9 (2) (f) of the General Data Protection Regulation.

Categories of personal data

We process the following categories of personal data about you in connection with CCTV:

General information in the form of photos and video recorded at our locations.

In special cases, personal data about criminal offences may be processed in connection with specific incidents

Recipients or categories of recipients

We may, depending on the circumstances, disclose your personal data to the following categories of recipients:

- Data processors, such as external IT suppliers, as part of the hosting, operation and support of the systems in which footage is stored and processed
- Security companies
- Lawyers and other advisers
- Public authorities, including the Police

Deletion of your personal data

Image and video material is stored for 30 days, after which the material is automatically deleted.

However, specific sequences of the video material and the personal data contained therein are stored in connection with the handling of specific cases and access requests for as long as it is necessary for the specific case or access request.

Your rights

According to the General Data Protection Regulation, you have a number of rights in relation to our processing of information about you.

Right of access

You have the right to access the information we process about you, as well as a number of additional information about the processing, cf. Article 15 of the General Data Protection Regulation.

In a number of cases, you have the right to have personal data deleted before the time of our general deletion occurs, cf. Article 17 of the General Data Protection Regulation.

Right to restriction of processing

In certain cases, you have the right to have the processing of your personal data limited to storage only, cf. Article 18 of the General Data Protection Regulation.

Right to object

In certain cases, you have the right to object to our otherwise lawful processing of your personal data, cf. Article 21 of the General Data Protection Regulation.

Right to data portability

In certain cases, you have the right to receive your personal data in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format and to have this personal data transferred from one data controller to another without hindrance, cf. Article 20 of the General Data Protection Regulation.

Complaint to the Data Protection Authority

You have the right to lodge a complaint with the National Data Protection Agency if you are dissatisfied with the way we process your personal data.
